WHAT IS NONMONOGAMY?

WHAT DOES "NON-MONOGAMY" MEAN?

An **umbrella term** for relationship structures that are not monogamous.



Polyamory (Poly):

An agreement between partners to have multiple romantic and/or sexual partners, if desired with all partners, having honest knowledge of other partnerships, boundaries, and agreements.

Hierarchical Poly:

A polyamorous structure where there is (usually) a "primary" or "anchor" partner and then additional partner(s).

Open Relationship:

Partners are not sexually exclusive; specifics of this agreement depend on each specific relationship.

Often, these structures are not considered polyamorous.

Non-hierarchical Poly:
A polyamorous
relationship structure
where there is not a
single "anchor" or
primary partner.

Polyfidelitous:

Partners (three or more)
who are in equal
relationships with each
other and agree to contain
sexual and romantic
relationships exclusively
with members of the group.

BUSTING NON-MONOGAMY MISCONCEPTIONS



Non-monogamous folks don't get jealous.

Sounds like:

"I could never be nonmonogamous, I'm just too jealous" Jealousy is a **feeling** that comes in varying degrees for most people! Non-monogamous folks often learn more skills to **manage** jealousy and communicate about it! Non-monomany has more to do with a skill set than an innate ability to "do it."

Non-monogamous people are just greedy!

Sounds like:
Why isn't one person
enough? Just pick one!

This is a phobic thing to say, relationships are not a limited resource to "hoard" or be greedy over. The number of ethical partners someone has is not a moral issue. **Do not perpetuate this!**

Non-monogamy is new and only for young people.

Sounds like:

They'll grow out of it, it's just trendy right now to date everyone"

Non-monogamy is not new or just a "trend" for young people. Across history and different settings, many adults of all ages have practiced ethical non-monogamy.
