What does it mean to be queer?

Queer is used as an umbrella term for folks who are a part of the LGTBQI+ community.

Queer is a reclaimed term. In the 19th century, the term was a slur meaning odd, strange, or other, used against members of the LGBTQI+ community.

Reclamation of the term <u>queer</u> began in the 1980s to push back against conservatism within, and outside of the LGBTQI+ community.

WHO IS QUEER?

"Queer" should <u>always</u> be a self-identified label.

Anyone who identifies as "queer" is queer!

No proof, experience, or aesthetic is needed.

The word queer has political social roots which means people in the same communities may feel differently about the term "queer" and that's okay!

Respect everyone's right to selfidentification with the terms that feel good to them!

DOES EVERYONE IN THE LGBTQI+ COMMUNITY IDENTIFY AS QUEER?

No!

Not everyone uses this term, and that's okay!

Remember:

Just because folks don't use the word "queer" to self-describe does not mean they are straight or cisgender.

Not everyone in the LGBTQI+ community identifies with the word <u>queer</u> and that's okay. When in doubt ask to make sure folks are comfortable with the terminology you're using for them.
