THIS IS A HARMFUL MYTH



FIRST OF ALL, CHILDREN <u>DO</u> LEARN ABOUT GENDER AND SEXUALITY.

(They learn all about <u>cisgenderism</u> and <u>heterosexuality</u>.)

Children are constantly bombarded with messaging about what it means to be straight and cis.

This position perpetuates the idea that people are born straight and become queer.


This isn't true.

In our society, there is an assumption that only queer people have a <u>sexuality</u> and a <u>gender identity</u>.

(Straight and cis people are just considered "normal" or "regular.")



Regardless of your orientation or identity, you have a gender and sexuality.*



*Note: Some folks identify as <u>agender</u>, meaning they do not identify with any gender and may prefer to not have any gender (including non-binary) ascribed to them. This is a valid identity! We are not here to deny the experiences of agender people.

Research shows that queer youth know and feel that they are queer before they have the vocabulary to articulate it (and way before any adults in their lives know.)

THE ROOTS OF PREJUDICE

- If someone is too young to see queer representation,
- **but** they are <u>not</u> too young to see straight representation,
- then this implies that there is something inherently sexual or abnormal about queerness.

This harmful ideology harkens back to the times of queer panic, when queer men were socially demonized (i.e. incarcerated and labeled as pedophiles or sexually deviant) for having consensual sex with adults.




REDUCING QUEER IDENTITIES TO SEXUAL BEHAVIOR PERPETUATES HARMFUL STEREOTYPES.
